



Embark on a journey of light and imagination in the illuminating interactive installation by Patch Theatre. With a UV torch as your paintbrush, paint and stencil your own voyage and steer ships that leave glowing paths of light in their wake.

As you explore Sea of Light, artworks by Contemporary Aboriginal visual artist Elizabeth Close are painted in light across the sea floor. These paintings speak to the connection between land and sea, the earth and waterways are informed by the diversity of the Australian landscape. They also reflect the deep relationship that Aboriginal and Torres Straight Islander people in Australia have with the Country.

Sea of Light brings together magical light and gentle soundscape to create a unique adventure for the whole family.

Our hero, Boy, feels nervous and confused down here on earth. He wants to escape, to be alone and far away from judgemental eyes.

Moral Compass, a manifestation of Boy's inner guide, transforms his blanket fort into a magical portal and through it, Boy travels by flying bicycle into the galaxy beyond! He meets Lamplighter, a colourful and expressive character who represents a missing piece of Boy he is yet to embrace.

Lamplighter shows Boy how big feelings can be boundless, and he doesn't have to hide them anymore.

When Moral Compass decides Boy no longer needs her they part with a tearful farewell, and her soul turns to stardust, leaving a path to guide him home.
